## Letting God Be God

We can waste so much of our lives fighting God. Somehow we think we actually know better than God. This thought comes out in many different ways, but the common way is through dissatisfaction with our lives. We look at our lives, and then we look at the lives of others who seem to have it better than ourselves. We wonder why we have to deal with so many problems, while it looks like other people are free of the worries that bother us so much. Why doesn't God change the way my life is going?

But often all we are looking at is the surface of life. We come to very hasty and shallow conclusions about things. We don't want to do the hard work of thinking more deeply about things. Reflection takes effort and can't be done in a hurry. But reflection and God-awareness leads to wisdom, rather than just to thoughtless judgments.

The simple fact of the matter is: we do not understand the mind and heart of God. "*my thoughts are not your thoughts, nor are your ways my ways, says the Lord*". Of course, the trick is to live with that reality instead of constantly fighting it. That is why the inner spiritual journey is one that we all need to be on. If we live only on the surface, we will always be fighting the apparent inequality of life, always wondering why our life is the way it is, constantly looking at other people's lives, wishing we could have their lives instead of the ones we find so difficult to live.

No doubt about it --- today's Gospel calls us to see things from an entirely different point of view. May God grant us the grace to know and believe in our hearts that God's way is always the best way.
