Now is the Time!

Our Parish will soon begin a new year of journeying with people who are interested in joining the Catholic Church. This faith journey process is called the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults or RCIA. We just recently finished one of the most exciting years in our Parish's history with many people joining the Church last Easter. Again this year we have inquirers asking about the RCIA process. We look forward to another grace filled year of growing spiritually along with our inquirers.

Who should participate in the RCIA? The whole Church community should participate! We do this by our daily life....living out the life and teachings of Jesus Christ. Through our example others are called to "Come and See".

Do you have a friend, co-worker or family member who has asked you about the Catholic Church? Now would be a good time to invite them to come to Mass with you. Tell them about the RCIA. There will be an invitation in our bulletin each week to come join this process. Please see that they get this invitation.

Are you interested in joining this process? If you are not baptized, were baptized in another Christian church or were baptized a Catholic but have not received the Initiation Sacraments (Baptism, Confirmation & Eucharist), please call to sign up and be part of the RCIA process this year.

Do you have children who have not received the Initiation Sacraments? If your children, over the age of 7, have not received the Sacraments, please call to sign them up for the RCIC (Rite of Christian Initiation of Children) process.

A Personal Invitation: You are cordially invited to sign up now for participation in the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (or children) RCIA (RCIC). Orientation for adults will be Wednesday, October 6, 2010 at 6:30 p.m. in O'Neill Hall. Orientation for children will be Saturday, October 2, 2010 at 2 p.m. in O'Neill Hall. 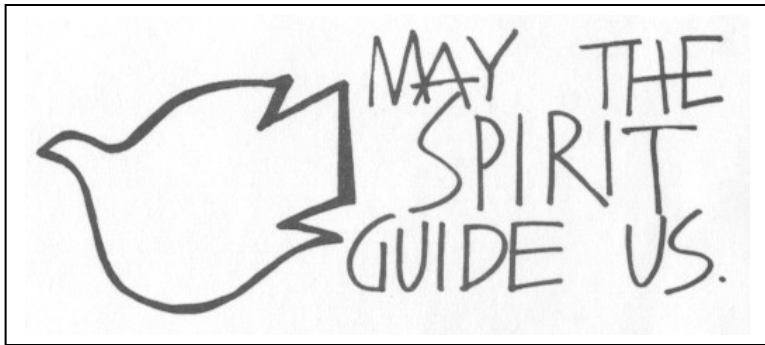
