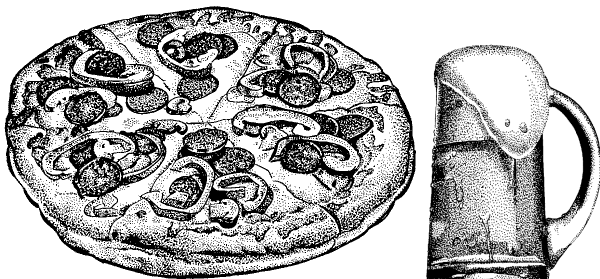

## JUSTICE CHALLENGE

On Monday we honor the memory of Martin Luther King, Jr., who worked on behalf of equality for all of God's children. King sought to end racial injustice in our country, and to do so through complete non-violence. Ironically, he paid the ultimate price for his beliefs when he was killed in an act of extreme violence. King once said, "At the center of non-violence stands the principle of love." He also was quoted as saying, "Hate cannot drive out hate; only love can do that." Your challenge this week is to reflect on how often you turn to violence-violent words, violent actions, violent feelings when you are in a conflict with someone else. Make a personal commitment to respond to other people's anger or hate or meanness with nonviolence. Pledge to make love the underlying motive and foundation on which you resolve your conflicts.

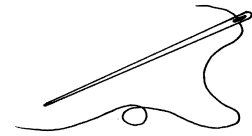
## SUPER BOWL SUNDAY
