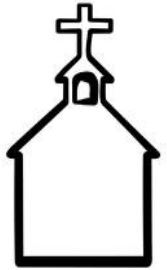

CHURCH SPACE

The assembly area of the church has been in a period of transition for the past two months with painting, repair work, and cleaning. We thank you for your patience and understanding during this process.



We are ready to partially move back in place. The icon painting of the Blessed Mother will be re-hung for a period of time until further discernment is made regarding the placement of a wood panel behind the icon.

Likewise, the candles are in place for use. Please remember to only use the candles provided by the church that are designed to avoid leaving a smoky residue on the walls. We are investigating the possibility of replacing the candle stand. Please let us know if you are interested in purchasing a new stand in memory of a loved one.

Station numerals and a cross will be temporarily placed around the assembly perimeter to mark the Stations of the Cross while we are in the process of discerning what should replace the old set which is in disrepair.

The Liturgy Committee is mindful of the liturgical environment; the goal is to refurbish the space within the parameters found in the General Instruction of the Roman Missal.
