STEWARDSHIP THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK OF JUNE 30th

There are two important stewardship messages included in today's readings. The first is the idea of calling; and the second is the objective of discipleship. These are reflected in the title of the U. S. Bishops' Pastoral Letter on Stewardship: Stewardship: A Disciple's Response.

Although it is symbolic in many ways, and thus may not be completely clear to us, the first reading from 1 Kings reflects that notion of being called. How does Elijah call Elisha? He does not speak, but he throws a mantle over him. We need to understand that this mantle, the cloak, was originally written adderet. There were three types of cloaks, but the adderet was the sign of a prophet. God has gifted each of us, and He has called each of us. Just as Elisha was called and given the gift of prophecy, we are each called and given gifts.

Stewardship is what we do with those gifts. In the Gospel from Luke Jesus calls each of us to discipleship. The call is relatively simple, just "Follow me." It is, of course, a call to discipleship.



As the Bishops strongly implied in their stewardship pastoral letter, stewardship is our response to that call. As followers of Christ, we are God's representatives. We are called to ministry according to the gifts each of us has received.

World Youth Day Update

50 pilgrims from Alaska have been affected by the bankruptcy proceedings of the tour operator coordinating the World Youth Day trip. Ten other dioceses in the United States have been affected by the bankrupt company as well. The Alaska Catholic Conference of Bishops is organizing the local effort to make sure that the pilgrims are still able to attend. There is a possibility of recovering some of the \$181,400 dollars through insurance and/or recovery in bankruptcy. In the meantime, we have to raise money to cover a substantial part of the costs. Consequently, second collections will be taken up around the state. In the Archdiocese, June 29th and 30th had been designated as the weekend. Since a second collection for St Vincent DePaul was already scheduled to occur on June 29th and 30th, we will hold our second collection for this cause on July 6th and 7th.
